The celebration of graduation from a Catholic high school is most specifically centered on Christ, and the Baccalaureate ceremony, religious in nature, finds its highest expression in union with Our Lord in the Mass. Admission to Baccalaureate Mass is not ticketed and will be open to families, guests and friends. Each senior will receive a Graduation Packet (consisting of a Senior Time line, directions to all events during Graduation week and 8 Graduation tickets).

## Campus Store

Textbook buyback will take place during at the end of May if applicable and permitted by publisher. Specific dates and times will be announced in the Eagle Update several weeks before the buyback dates. Please look for details in May.

## California Scholarship Federation (CSF)

CSF Life Members will wear a gold cord and medallion at graduation and a CSF Gold Honor Seal will be affixed to their diplomas. Life Membership is awarded to students who have qualified for membership during four semesters (grades from freshman, sophomore, junior, and senior years) with at least one semester of membership during senior year.

Accordingly, seniors should apply using their grades from the fall semester of their senior year. If a senior does not meet the life membership requirements after the fall semester of his or her senior year, his or her spring semester grades may be considered. Seniors who need their eighth semester grades to qualify for life membership may not receive the gold cord for the graduation ceremony unless they take the initiative to bring the CSF advisor their unofficial transcript that includes their eighth semester grades (available two days before graduation in the counseling office) and make arrangements to pick up the gold cord prior to the day of the ceremony. Printouts from Aeries will not be accepted as these are not necessarily students' report card grades. Grades from freshman year may be used to qualify for CSF membership, but they do not count towards life membership. All membership records are available on the California Scholarship Federation section of the school website.

## Caps and Gowns

The cost of the cap, gown and tassel is covered in the Graduation fee. Please be sure to fill out the appropriate box on the order form, clearly stating your height, weight and name so your cap and gown will be delivered accurately and on time. Jostens will be visiting Religion classes during the fall to distribute paperwork.

**Caps, gowns and tassels are issued to seniors Graduation Practice.** These are issued only to those who have met all academic requirements, are in good standing with the Discipline Office and are cleared of any financial obligations with the Business Office. ## The Lumen Christi Service Project, Junior and Senior Year

The Christian service program at SMCHS provides an opportunity for students to encounter Jesus in the most vulnerable members of society. Through the service program, students have the opportunity to explore how God calls us personally bring light (*Lumen Christi*) into the world.

- **The Lumen Christi Project:** During junior and senior years, students serve with any non-profit whose outreach is direct (face-to-face) work with the vulnerable and marginalized. This includes serving people with disabilities, animals and the environment, people suffering economic and social poverty, and people who need companionship in their faith journey
- The Lumen Christi Project requires 20 hours of direct service and a final reflection for both the junior and the senior year. There are no “roll-over” hours from junior year to senior year.
- All service hours, whether for the Lumen Christi project or extracurricular, must provide **direct (face-to-face) contact** with those being served over a sustained amount of time. **All agencies need to be nonprofit, except for hospitals or eldercare facilities.**
- Students use MobileServe as the online system to enter and verify all hours, both for their required hours and hours done above the requirement.
- Students do not receive letter grades for their Lumen Christi project. Rather, completion of the project (hours and paper) **is a graduation requirement. If a student does not complete their Lumen Christi project, he/she will not receive his/her diploma.**

- January/February Deadline – **Friday, November 6<sup>th</sup>**

Diplomas are issued to all graduating seniors who have successfully met all academic, service, financial and citizenship requirements. Diplomas will be mailed home after Graduation.

## Grad Night

Grad Night 2021 is an all-night party, organized by the Activities office and senior class parents to ensure a safe, drug and alcohol-free graduation celebration.

The National Commission against Drunk Driving has reported that drinking is the number one killer of teenagers. However, new campaigns to stop underage drinking by party-prone teens, such as Grad Night, have positively affected these statistics. SMCHS believes that our parents can offer graduates a graduation celebration that they will love, in a safe, drug and alcohol free atmosphere.

In an effort to ensure a safe, drug and alcohol-free celebration, students are not allowed to bring food, drinks, book bags or large purses to this event.

## Graduation

Admission is by ticket only. Children 2 years and younger who will be lap-sitting will not need a ticket for admission. **Please note that a Graduation Announcement is not a valid ticket for admission.** Each senior will receive a Graduation Packet (consisting of a Senior Timeline, directions to all events during graduation week, 8 Graduation tickets, etc.).

### Dress Code:

- Gentlemen should wear their cap and gown and dress shoes, dress slacks, dress shirt and a tie.
- Ladies should wear their cap and gown and nice dressy outfits.
- Corsages, leis or boutonniere may not be worn during the graduation ceremony
- All students wear the medallion they received at the Baccalaureate Mass. NHS, CSF, IB students may also wear their hoods and cords.

## Graduation Announcements

Graduation announcements are often used by families to “announce” their student’s upcoming Graduation. These items may be ordered directly from Jostens. Orders will be collected during lunch on days Jostens visits, which will be communicated in students’ daily announcements and the weekly Eagle Update that is sent to parents via email. Each student will receive 25 announcements as part of their paid Graduation fee. If you would like to order additional announcements you may purchase them through the Jostens website. Orders may also be placed online through the SMCHS store on the Jostens website. Announcements will be distributed to seniors during lunch around March 2021. It is suggested that they be mailed to family and friends three weeks prior to graduation.

**\*Please note that a Graduation Announcement is not a valid ticket for admission for Graduation.**

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## Graduation Fee

Each graduating Senior will be assessed a Graduation Fee of \$300. The fee was added to the FACTS tuition account at time of registration and is due by August 31<sup>st</sup>. If not paid by August 31<sup>st</sup>, an additional \$50 late fee will be imposed for each month that remains unpaid. The Graduation Fee covers the expenses of the graduation ceremony, Baccalaureate Mass, yearbook signing luncheon, cap and gown, 25 announcements, etc. The fee is nonrefundable and does not cover Grad Night.

The Graduation fee **does not** include the cost of the Talon yearbook, Senior Tributes or Grad Night.

## Graduation Policy

In order to receive a diploma from Santa Margarita Catholic High School, a student must:

- Have successfully completed a minimum of 270 credits of coursework.
- Completed 20 credits of Religion at Santa Margarita if a transfer student.
- Have no un-remediated grades of “F” on his or her transcript.
- Have a cumulative academic GPA of 2.0 or better.
- Be in good standing with the Attendance and Discipline Office.
- Have no outstanding financial obligations with the Business Office.
- Have completed all Christian Service obligations.

A senior who has the misfortune of receiving a grade of “F” on his or her transcript will not receive a diploma from Santa Margarita Catholic High School until the “F” has been remediated. In order for this student to participate in graduation exercises he or she must:

- Have a cumulative academic GPA of 2.0 or better.
- Not have more than 2 “F” grades on the transcript.
- Be in good standing with the Attendance and Discipline Office.
- Have no outstanding financial obligations with the Business Office.

All incomplete work must be turned in by the 80% posting date in order for this work to be calculated into final grades. Any senior who is enrolled in a non-Santa Margarita online class needed to meet graduation requirements must have all work and the final exam completed by May 1<sup>st</sup> with the official transcript received by the counselor no later than May 10<sup>th</sup>. Any student who has a “School Hold” on his or her diploma will not receive the diploma until the hold is removed. Students who have a “School Hold” on their diploma because of incomplete graduation requirements must have those deficiencies completed by August 31<sup>st</sup> of the graduation year. If applicable, a transcript from the community college or university must be submitted to Santa Margarita for the completed work. The date of graduation on the transcript will reflect the year the graduation requirements have been met if not done by Aug 31<sup>st</sup> of their graduation year.

## **Graduation Practice**

All seniors **must** attend a mandatory graduation practice. You will receive your caps and gowns at this practice. Any student absent from graduation practice will not be allowed to attend the graduation ceremony.

## **Kairos Retreats**

The Kairos retreat program is about spending time with God at His invitation and being open to experience His presence. It can transform your outlook and experience of life as you know it. Seniors attend this four day retreat to experience a compassionate and loving community, intense prayer, and interior reflection.

Kairos is ultimately an experience of living in a rare and unique kind of Christian fellowship, similar to that of the early church community. Because of the unique nature of Kairos the retreat fills up very fast. It is good to apply ahead of time to ensure there will be a spot on the roster. Kairos is held at the Whispering Winds Catholic Conference Center located in Julian, CA. Students pack a sleeping bag, pillow, clothes and a few personal items. The rest is taken care of by the Kairos Leadership Team.

Everyone on retreat will get the opportunity to share their own unique life experiences. Shared prayer and group discussions are a major focus every day. While the format of the retreat is shaped around Catholic Tradition, Kairos is open to students from all religious backgrounds. Kairos is not based upon religious dogma, but on a process of personal discovery, in which each student is encouraged to find and engage his/her own sense of spirituality and moral accountability.

Students that attend are also invited to become a retreat leader after their first Kairos retreat. This is another great way to “give back” and to inspire others to live out their faith in God and in others.

## **Selective Service Registration**

All men must register with the Selective Service within 30 days of their eighteenth birthday. Registration is a way our government keeps a list of names of men from which to draw in case of a national emergency requiring rapid expansion of our Armed Forces. By registering all young men, the Selective Service ensures that a future draft will be fair and equitable. Most men turning 18 can register by mail, if they receive a Selective Service form in the mail. Forms are also available at any U.S. post office, and you can now register on-line at [www.sss.gov](http://www.sss.gov). The form asks for the young man's full name, address, date of birth, telephone number, and Social Security number (if he has one). On the form that is sent in, his signature is also required.

## **Senior Cruise**

## Senior Trips

SMCHS does not sponsor a senior trip. Information you may receive from travel agencies is not sanctioned by our school. Nor do we allow other agencies to advertise such trips on our campus.

A number of travel agencies offer trips without formal supervision. Parents considering such trips should carefully review the material you have received. If you read the fine print in the brochures you may find that the tour companies' "chaperones" are only there to make sure student accommodations and travel arrangements are met. As a result, students are placed in an environment where they are not safe. Sometimes, trip activities organized by the tour operator are held in bars, clubs or near a place where alcohol is made readily available. The environment created by these parties and the availability of unlimited alcohol is dangerous and potentially catastrophic.

## Senior Tablet Purchase

### How much will it cost to purchase the Lenovo Yoga?

The purchase price will be announced in March 2021. This purchased device cannot be used by any current or future SMCHS student as it will no longer be under warranty or include any of the necessary school software.

### What will be available to the student on the device?

The device will be returned to factory settings. Students will have access to the Microsoft Office Suite and their Office 365 accounts until September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2021. The suite includes OneNote, Word, PowerPoint, and Excel as well as access to OneDrive and all saved files. Students can then link their Microsoft account and reinstall any apps/games they have purchased.

### How will the purchase program work?

- If you plan on buying the tablet, please complete the purchase process. You will need a copy of your confirmation when you return your device for servicing.
- All graduating students must return their tablet to the Tech Service Center during the final week of school.
- The Tech Service Center will then restore your student's device to its original factory settings while maintaining Office 365 access, which includes Word, Power Point, OneNote, etc. By returning your device to the Tech Service Center, you agree that you have backed up all your files to your Office 365 account. SMCHS is not responsible for any data lost while restoring the device to factory settings.
- Devices will be available for pick up from the Tech Service Center.

### What if I don't want to purchase the tablet?

All seniors who choose to not purchase their tablet must return it to the Tech Service Center during the last week of school. ***Students will not be allowed to walk in commencement exercises if the device is not returned.*** There is no charge for returning the tablet to SMCHS if there are no other issues, damage, etc.

## **Tuition**

Tuition must be paid in full by April 30, 2021 in order to be able to participate in any graduation activities.

## **Voter Registration**

The Activities Office offers voter registration forms to any interested student. You may register to vote at any time throughout the year. However, you must be registered to vote at least 29 days prior to an election to vote in that election. You can also register online at: [www.ocvote.com](http://www.ocvote.com)

You are eligible to register to vote if:

- You are or will be at least 18 years of age on or before the day of the next election, and
- You are a citizen of the United States, and
- You are a resident of California, and
- You are not in prison or on parole for a felony conviction.

## **Senior Class Panorama & Yearbook Luncheon**

All seniors are invited to attend the Senior Class Panorama & Yearbook Luncheon from. Seniors should wear their college sweatshirt for a special senior panorama picture to be taken before the catered lunch buffet is served. The cost of this event is included in the Graduation Fee. Alumni Association information will also be available. Please Note: Students must purchase their own yearbooks.

### ***Talon Yearbook***

**The procedure for purchasing a yearbook will be the same as the last few years.** A yearbook will be ordered for every student who does not opt out by **October 9<sup>th</sup>, 2020**. The charge (\$100) will be added to your tuition account after the opt out date of October 9<sup>th</sup>, 2020. An email will be coming in the beginning months of school with directions on how to opt out.

### **Senior Tributes**

SMCHS parents may order a Tribute for their child through the company, Tribute Ads; a full service online production company that offers various sizes, templates, and colors to create your student's Senior Tribute. They will simplify your creation process; however, you still have the option to create a tribute of your own design.

**The yearbook staff at SMCHS will not accept payment or tributes.** All submissions and payments of Senior Tributes will be done through the Tribute Ads website, [www.tributeads.com](http://www.tributeads.com).

While you create your tribute, please remember our school charism: **“Caritas Christi”** as you select photos and messages. No tongue rings, tattoos, hand gestures of any kind, (including the peace sign), containers resembling alcohol, and no suggestive photos or nude baby photos.

The school still reserves the right to proof/edit all tributes and photos before final publishing submission.
