



Brian Finneran '94

Brad and Brian Finneran were not only brothers, they were twins. So it was fitting that they both received football scholarships together to Villanova where they continued to dominate their opponents at the receiver position. In 1997 Brian Finneran won the Walter Payton Award which recognizes the top Division I-AA football player in the nation. Finneran joins past winners such as NFL stars John Friesz, Steve McNair and Dave Meggett. Prior to the 1998 season. Brian signed with the Seattle Seahwaks making him the second Eagle to reach the professional ranks, and the first to reach the NFL. From Seattle, Finneran played for the NFL Europe Barcelona Dragons where he was named All-NFL Europe. He then went on to have a lengthly career playing for the Atlanta Falcons.A recipient of the Walter Payton award as a senior at Villanova University, which is given to the nation's topDivision 1-AA offensive player. Finneran was signed by the Seattle Seahawks as an undrafted free agent in 1998. Finneran also saw time as a member of the Barcelona Dragons, Philadelphia Eagles and the Atlanta Falcons. He is now a host for a morning radio sports talk show, 680the fan in Atlanta.

Kris Farris '95

Yet another Santa Margarita Graduate has left his mark on the NCAA. UCLA Tackle and Eagle Alumni Kris Farris won the 1998 Outland Trophy Award which celebrates the nation's top interior lineman. Farris won the award as

junior, and didn't give up a sack the entire season. Kris was also named to the first team AP All-American team. The Pittsburgh Steelers selected Farris in the third round (seventy-fourth pick overall) of the 1999 NFL Draft. He later played for the Buffalo Bills. Over the years. Farris has helped out the Eagles O-Line during summers assisting coach Mielke and the rest of the offensive Line one-on-one drills. While playing for UCLA, won the Outland Trophy, awarded to the best United States college football interior lineman. Farris was drafted in the 3rd round of the NFL Draft (74th Pick overall) by the Pittsburgh Steelers and would go on to play for the Buffalo Bills.

Carson Palmer '98

In two years as the starting QB for Santa Margarita, Carson lived a fairy tale life. He finished his high school career with 27 school records. He was All-Everything and finished by having his iersev retired after being named the Division V Co-Offensive MVP and two straight CIF championships. Palmer received a full scholarship to USC where he went on to break many of USC's passing records. Palmer won the Heisman Trophy for the top collegiate football player in the nation. After leading USC to a regular season record of 10-2 and a ranking of 4th in the nation. Palmer was named the CNNSI College Football Player of the year, CNNSI 1st Team All-American, Football Writers Association of America's first team All-American. CBS Sportsline.com First Team All-American, ESPN.com First Team All-American, Pac-10 Co-



Offensive Player of the Year, USC's Most Valuable Player, and also won the prestigious Unitas Golden Arm Award given to the top senior quarterback in the nation. Palmer went on to play for the Cincinnati Bengals, Oakland Raiders and Phoenix Cardinals in the NFL. Palmer won the Heisman trophy, the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm, Pac-10 Offensive Player of the Year and was a Consensus All-American in 2002. Palmer was the first guarterback out of USC to win the Heisman Trophy and led the Trojans to an Orange Bowl victory in 2002 where he was named the game's MVP. He is a two-time NFL Pro-Bowler ('05 and '06) and has played for the Cincinnati Bengals, Oakland Raiders and Arizona Cardinals.

Gavin Escobar '09

2013 NFL second round draft pick (47th overall) out of San Diego State by the Dallas Cowboys. While at SDSU, Escobar was a first team All-Mountain West Conference selection and entered the NFL Draft after his junior season. In 2017, Escobar was picked up by the Kansas City Chiefs before joining the Miami Dolphins in 2018.

AJ Cruz '09

Cruz was an All-Ivy league selection at Brown University before playing arena football for the Arizona Rattlers and Los Angeles Kiss and was signed by the Chicago Bears 90-man roster in 2015. After sustaining an injury in the final day of camp, Cruz was released by the Bears and then signed with the Miami Dolphins.



While at Brown, he earned first team All-American honors and is one of only 41 players in Ivy league history to earn 1st Team All-Ivy league, three times.

Max Tuerk '12

Santa Margarita's first US Army All-American selection and Tuerk was the starting center at USC. Tuerk is the first true freshman in USC history to start at left tackle and is the 14th multiple-time captain in USC history. At USC, Max had 33 career starts (14 at left guard, 13 at center, 5 at left tackle, 1 at right tackle) and was a third year starter. Turek was drafted in the third round of the 2016 NFL draft by by the San Diego Chargers.

Johnny Stanton '13

Johnny Stanton was a gamechanging quarterback both as a passer and runner for Coach Harry Welch at Santa Margarita Catholic High School. Stanton's senior season was cut short by a knee injury in week five. Before he was injured, Stanton helped his team to a consensus ranking among the nation's top five prep teams. In his shortened season, Stanton completed 59-of-88 passes for 949 yards and 12 touchdowns, while rushing for 386 yards and 10 touchdowns on just 47 carries. Stanton's efforts earned him September's National High School Coaches Association/GTM Sportswear Athlete of the Month award. Santa Margarita was 5-0 at the time of Stanton's injury and went on to finish with a 9-3 record. Stanton was one of California's most dynamic offensive players



in the 2011 season, helping Santa Margarita to a 13-2 record and the **CIF Southern Section Division I** state title. Stanton completed better than 60 percent of his passes for 2,439 yards and 13 touchdowns, while rushing for 1,428 yards and 21 touchdowns. Stanton was the first-team quarterback on the Los Angeles Times All-Area team and was the MVP of the SouthernCaliforniaPreps. com All-Pac 5 football team. As a sophomore in 2010, Stanton started at safety for the Santa Margarita defense and also logged time at quarterback. Stanton made 72 tackles on defense, while posting 375 passing yards and 223 rushing yards. Stanton showed his quarterback ability in leading a comeback win against St. John Bosco as a sophomore, throwing for 185 yards and three touchdowns in the second half. Stanton was generally regarded as one of the nation's top dualthreat QB prospects. Sports Next ranked him among the nation's top 30 guarterbacks overall. He was also regarded as one of the top 40 players in California. Stanton was also a finalist at the prestigious Elite 11 Quarterback Camp in 2012 in California.

River Cracraft '13

River Cracraft was a four-year letterwinner for coach Harry Welch. As a sophomore he earned All-State and All-Trinity League honors after making 35 receptions for 469 yards and 41 tackles and three interceptions. As a junior he earned All-CIF honors after catching 43 passes for 639 yards and five



touchdowns while only playing in eight games. He helped SMCHS to a CIF State D1 title and a 13-2 record. As a senior he was named All-County by the Orange County Register, All-Trinity League and Trinity League Offensive Player of the Year after recording 56 receptions for 935 yards and nine touchdowns. He also intercepted one pass and recorded five pass breakups. He finished his career with 134 career receptions second to former NFL wideout Brian Finneran. Cracraft finished his career with 2,043 career receiving vards, third-most in SMCHS history. He was selected to play in South Bay BMW West Coast Bowl, caught two passes for 32 yards including a 17-yard touchdown. Cracraft was rated three stars by ESPN.com, Rivals.com and Scout. com and was ranked the No. 91 overall prospect out of California by ESPN.com. He also played baseball and ran trackand earned a full scholarship to Washington State. As a junior at Washington State was named to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List. He earned All-Pac-12 Conference honorable mention as a senior. Cracraft finished his Washington State career playing in 42 games with 218 catches for 2701 yards and 20 TDs. River Cracraft is a wide receiver and a return specialist for the Denver Broncos. Cracraft played four seasons for the Cougars, appearing in 42 games. He recorded 218 receptions (No. 2 in school history behind Gabe Marks), 2,701 receiving yards and 20 touchdowns while at Washington State before tearing

his ACL near the end of his senior season. After going unselected in the 2017 NFL Draft due to his knee injury, Cracraft was signed by the Denver Broncos to the team's practice squad on October 17. 2017 but was released by the team three days later after sustaining an injury in practice. He was subsequently re-signed to the Broncos' practice squad later on in the season on December 18, 2017 and signed a futures contract with the team at the end of the season. Cracraft was signed to the Broncos' practice squad after being cut from the team's active roster at the end of the 2018 preseason and was promoted to the active roster on November 2, 2018. He made his NFL debut two days later in the Broncos' 19-17 loss to the Texans. returning a punt for five yards.

Jeremy McNichols '14

Jeremy was an all-league RB/ WR for the Eagles. As a senior he rushed 163 times for 798 yards and eight touchdowns, and hauled in 17 passes for 191 yards and two touchdowns. He also played defense recording 34 tackles. Jeremy received a scholarship to Boise State University. Jeremy was selected in the fifth round of the NFL Draft (162nd overall) by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the 2017 NFL Draft. In his junior year at Boise State, he was also a Doak Walker Award semifinalist finishing the season with 27 touchdowns which ranked him second in the nation and third all-time in a single season at Boise State. He finished his thre-year career at Boise State with 3,205 yards rushing and 103



receptions for 1,089 yards. Jeremy is the fifth Eagle to be drafted into the NFL. Jeremy played football for the Eagles where he played as a running back and wide receiver, where he rushed for 877 yards with nine touchdowns and had 72 receptions for 934 yards and 10 touchdowns. After Santa Margarita, McNichols went on to play as a true freshman at Boise State, where he played running back. McNichos was drafted by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the 2017 NFL Draft in the 5th round, 162nd overall. He now plays for the Tennessee Titans.

Grant Calcaterra '16

Grant was selected #198 (6th round) in the 2022 NFL Draft by the Philadelphia Eagles. As a senior at Southern Methodist, Calcaterra caught 38 passes for 465 yards and four touchdowns. He was an NFL Combine Invite. Reese's Senior Bowl Invite. Second-Team All-AAC, Mackey Award Watch List, NFLPA Collegiate Bowl Big Board, College Gridiron Showcase Watch List, PFF All-AAC Third Team, Phil Steele All-AAC Second Team, NFF Hampshire Honor Society and a Team Captain. He played 3 years at Oklahoma where he caught 41 passes for 637 yards with 9 touchdowns and was an All-Big 12 First-Team selection.



RECAP OF LAST WEEK'S GAME @ SAN JUAN HILLS

SMC took the field at "The Badlands" -- home of San Juan Hills -- for their 2022 season opener. The contest was the defacto "Game of the Week" in the county as it was dubbed so by the *Orange County Register* and broadcast on live television throughout many markets in the country. With a full house of over 2,600 strong, the Eagles found themselves in a dogfight as they couldn't capitalize on several early opportunities and led only 5-0 at half.

The athleticism and skill of the Eagles was certainly on display as SMC fought back to prevail, 18-8. Jaxon Potter demonstrated his ability to be a real on the roll out, as he passed for 180 yards and hitting nearly 66.0 percent of his throws. He also scored a key touchdown with a sneak in the fourth quarter. Emmett Mosley's skill to gain yards after the catch dazzled all as he made his first appearance for SMC and finished with nine receptions for 94 yards and a score. Skilled receivers Bain Eiseman and Niko Lopez proved to be deadly downfield for the opposition as they garnered long pass receptions of 35 and 36 yards respectively.

The SMC defense was at its best as it shutdown the Stallions with five sacks, 12 tackles for loss, one safety and one interception. San Juan's quarterback, Michael Tollefson, one of their biggest offensive weapons, was limited to just 83 yards passing on six completions and 53 yards rushing on 15 carries. Three of the sackers included Noah Sulick, Ben Durham and Collins Acheampong. Durham also added the safety while Blake Wilson was credited with the pick. Wilson, a man of many skills, also punted for a 44.0-yard average, including a boot of 53 yards, and kicked a PAT. Perhaps the best defensive effort was turned in by Jacob Bower. The senior hybrid safety-linebacker contributed 16 total tackles (1 for loss), recovered a fumble, had one quarterback hurry and a half sack.

grandchildren. Pete loved sports with a special fondness and passion for Notre Dame football, UCLA basketball, Angel's baseball and Santa Margarita football. Our thoughts and prayers go out to all as we honor Pete here tonight.

HEAD COACH ANTHONY ROUZIER

Anthony Rouzier begins his third season as the Head Varsity Coach at Santa Margarita Catholic High School. Prior to taking the reigns of the program in the spring of 2021, Rouzier coached at SMC for three seasons, first serving as the linebacker coach and then as the Eagles' defensive coordinator. The path to Head Coach started on August 27, 2020 when Rouzier was named on an interim basis. On February 5, 2021, Rouzier was named fulltime Head Coach by school President Andy Sulick.

Rouzier played collegiately at the University of Connecticut in 2005. There he was the first true freshman walk-on to start in the Division-era of the school. He then transferred to the University of Massachusetts as a scholarship athlete and was a member of two Colonial Athletic Conference championships teams. In the classroom, Rouzier earned All-Academic All-Conference honors in 2007 and 2008.

After his collegiate playing days, in 2014, Rouzier coached at Amherst Regional High School (Massachusetts) where he started as the linebacker coach and was promoted to Defensive Coordinator mid-season. Rouzier then proceeded to coach the outside linebackers at Winston-Salem State University (North Carolina) in the spring of 2015. Shortly after that, he returned as a graduate assistant at his Alma Mater, the University of Massachusetts. There he worked with the defensive backs in 2015 and linebackers in 2016.

Rouzier then found his way to Europe to coach with the Hamburg Huskies of the German Football League. There, in 2017, he was the interim Head Coach and Defensive Coordinator. For his success, Rouzier was promoted to and accepted the Head Coaching position. Rouzier was also the Defensive Coordinator for the Under-17 Hamburg State All-Star team and worked with a recruiting service that helped European prospects earn Division 1 college scholarships in the United States. One of the other German coaches was current SMC assistant coach Sean Embree. It was Embree who convinced Rouzier that coaching at SMC would be worth his while and he soon found his way to South Orange County.

Born and raised in Massachusetts, Rouzier married his wife Elwira, who he met in Germany in 2018. He holds Juris Doctor and Master's of Business Administration degrees from Florida International University and a Bachelor's Degree in Journalism from the University of Massachusetts. He is the co-creator of a children's book and non-profit organization that promotes health and wellness.

Over the recent offseason, Coach Rouzier and his talented staff have developed an innovative approach to expand the depth and breadth of the program. These activities and processes include:

- Attraction of several high profile prospects via transfer
- Individual player participation in over 55 camps, showcases and events throughout the West
- Scheduling almost one dozen 7-on-7 passing tournaments and scrimmages between all levels of the program
- Conducting multiple offsite team building and leadership events
- Improvement of communication pipeline with a myriad of team information being offered. For example: first-ever preseason team newsletter
- Development and support of dedicated student-produced media programming covering all aspects of the team

<u>Spotlight</u>: Last fall, All CIF-Southern Section Division 1 receiver Grant Gray led the Cougars with 61 catches for 956 yards (15.7 average) and 10 touchdowns to help Norco earn a spot in the CIF-SS playoffs. In the spring, he was the baseball team's table setter from the lead off position. Gray batted .352 with a team-high 35 runs scored in helping the Cougars claim their first Big VIII League title since 2015. <u>Previous Game Summary (08/26/21)</u>: The schedule got more difficult for the Eagles as they headed east on the 91 Freeway to the Inland Empire for a Thursday date at Norco. On special teams, two kickers combined to connect for three field goals. Jonathan Connor Teasley hit from 41 and 33 yards out, while Blake Wilson was successful from 46 yards.
