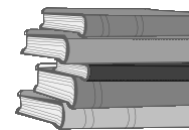




SMCHS Summer Reading List 2021-2022

Please note that movie versions of these literary works are often significantly different from the sources. **Please buy only the versions with the ISBN numbers listed below.** It is important that your copy matches your teacher's and your classmates' copies. You must bring the literary works the first day of class in August. It is useful to keep a reading log or journal as you read, make notes about the characters, plot, setting, and your feelings about the literary works.

Summer literary works are not available for purchase in the Eagles' Nest Campus Store but can be purchased from local bookstores. Local bookstores will gladly order any literary works not in stock. 1. From the English Summer Reading webpage, please download the **"Guide to Active Reading"** and **"How to Annotate"** for instruction and assistance as you read. You are to annotate, highlight, and use marginalia of the text.
2. **Using the packet provided on the department website**, read directions carefully and complete the packet using complete sentences. Be mindful of the necessary time and effort as some questions require research and in-depth analysis. The packet is due the first full day of class.

1. Download the **"Guide to Active Reading"** from the **English Summer Assignment** page on the SM website, under the "Academics" tab.
2. Carefully read, highlight, and annotate the text.
3. Read, highlight, and annotate BOTH literary criticisms on The Odyssey, found on the English page under "Summer Assignments" on the SM website.
4. You will write a critical review/summary of each criticism. For each summary, identify the critic's thesis in your topic sentence. In other words, what is the primary focus of the critic's argument? The remainder of the summary should PARAPHRASE the critic's argument, with at least 3 direct quotations from the criticism as evidence of the argument.
5. Each critical review should be typed (Times New Roman 12 font, double-spaced) on a separate page and should be a minimum of one page in length.

THIS ASSIGNMENT IS DUE THE FIRST DAY OF CLASS. YOU WILL BE TESTED ON THE TEXT AND WRITE AN ESSAY DURING THE FIRST FEW WEEKS OF THE SCHOOL YEAR.

Students will read the text ACTIVELY and annotate the novel (with highlighting and notes). Students will receive points on the first day of school for these annotations. Take note of character development and thematic elements, as well as Golding's overall statement about human nature. Students will write an essay during the first two weeks of school regarding important themes, so reading comprehension and insight are essential to success.

Active reading includes highlighting, annotating, and marginal notations. Download the "Guide to Active Reading" from the SMCHS website for suggestions.

Closely read and annotate Simon Armitage's translation of *Sir Gawain and the Green Knight*. Pay especially close attention to the imagery of Gawain's shield, the pentangle, the hart, the boar, the fox, and the green girdle. Come to class ready to discuss your interpretations of these symbols and the way in which they suggest meaning.

You are required to read the text ACTIVELY (highlight and annotate with marginalia). Annotations will be checked for a grade the first day of school. Download the "Guide to Active Reading" from the SMCHS website for suggestions. Use active reading techniques, and trace the key characters/symbols/themes in the novel. This information will be used to craft your first writing assignment of the school year which will be done within the first two weeks of school. If you do not read the novel, you will be at a distinct disadvantage when school begins.
