

Sophomore Service Project: Agnus Dei/Second Harvest Food Bank



301,000 people in Orange County are at risk of hunger every month. 1 in 6 children in OC are at risk of hunger, and 22% of seniors are at risk of hunger. Santa Margarita sophomores are part of the solution through their work with Second Harvest Food Bank. Second Harvest feeds 250,000 people in Orange County every month, and is the largest nonprofit hunger relief organization in our community.

Sophomores make one trip to Second Harvest during the year via their Religion class. These trips are organized and facilitated by Campus Ministry.

On their class's assigned day, students meet in Campus Ministry, G-131 at 7:25am. We take role and get on the bus by 7:45 am. We arrive at the Second Harvest no later than 8:20. There is a quick introduction, we receive our assignments, and begin work at 8:30 am. At 10:00 am, we take a 15-minute nutrition break, and return to work until 11:15. We arrive back at school by noon. Lunch is provided for students in Campus Ministry. After lunch, students log their service hours in x2vol, watch a portion of a documentary on hunger, do a reflective activity, and the day closes with Mass in the Chapel at 1:30pm.
